1. BEFORE YOU GO

Passports

Your passport must be valid for at least 6 months after your trip ends.

Indonesia National Park Authority requires Aggressor to submit each guest's passport details 7 days before departure to process the diving permit. No name changes can be made within 7 days of departure. Passport details are taken from the GIS — failure to complete the GIS will result in denied boarding.

Children traveling: Some countries have special rules for children leaving the country. Check your government's travel website for requirements.

Visa

Indonesia requires all travelers to have a valid passport. Most nationalities can use the Indonesia Visa on Arrival (e-VOA), available online or at the airport. The e-VOA costs approximately USD 35, is valid for 30 days, and can be extended once.

You are responsible for:

- Getting the correct visa for Indonesia
- Having documents to re-enter your home country
- Checking visa rules for any connecting flights

Visa and entry requirements can change without notice. Always verify before traveling.

All Indonesia Arrival Card

All travelers entering Indonesia must complete the All-Indonesia Arrival Card online within 3 days (72 hours) before arrival. The form combines immigration, customs, and health declarations into one submission.

How to complete:

- Visit allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id
- Select "English" and "Foreign Visitor"
- Fill in personal, travel, transport, accommodation, and health/customs details

- Submit the form and save the QR code
- Present the QR code (printed or on your device) along with your passport upon arrival

Required Forms

You need two things before you can dive and a third if you plan to do scuba training:

1. GUEST INFORMATION SYSTEM (GIS)

- What:* Aggressor's online cruise application forms, including waiver and travel details
When: Complete 14 days before departure
How: You'll receive a link by email. If you didn't get it, contact reservations.



Include your flight arrival time or hotel name in the GIS.

2. DIVE CERTIFICATION CARD (C-CARD)

- What:* Your diving certification card
Bring: The physical card or digital proof
Note: If diving with Nitrox, bring your Nitrox certification card as well.

3. MEDICAL FORM (RSTC) *(Only if doing scuba training)*

- What:* Diving Medical History Form
When: Required only if you plan to take a scuba training or certification course during your trip.
How:

- Download the form now at <http://www.aggressor.com/RSTCMedical.pdf>
- Answer all questions honestly
- The form will tell you if your answers require a doctor's approval.
- If no doctor approval is needed, you can sign it yourself
- Print it and bring it to the yacht



ALREADY HAVE ONE? If you have a medical form signed by a doctor in the last 12 months, you can use that instead.



There are no doctors once the yacht leaves the dock. If you need a doctor's signature and don't have it, you cannot participate in any SCUBA training classes.

What if I forget to complete these forms?

- An incomplete or missing GIS will result in denied boarding and possible trip cancellation without refund.
- You cannot dive without a certification card.
- You cannot participate in SCUBA training courses without a medical form.

Travel & Health Insurance

Aggressor Adventures strongly recommends all guests purchase insurance to protect their investment and health.

SUGGESTED COVERAGE:

- Travel Insurance (Trip Cancellation and Interruption)

- Dive Insurance (Dive Accident and Medical)
- Equipment Insurance

CONSIDER ADDING:

- "Cancel For Any Reason" (CFAR) upgrade – extends coverage beyond traditional policies without the constraints of “covered situations”.
- "Liveaboard Rider" upgrade - addresses liveaboard-specific issues such as missed dives due to illness, weather, or accidents to others, which impact your experience and more.

These policies provide financial security if unexpected events occur.

2. PREPARING FOR YOUR ADVENTURE (2-4 WEEKS BEFORE)

Recommended Packing:

Travel light. Space on the liveaboard yacht is limited.

LUGGAGE: Use soft luggage, such as duffel bags (not hard suitcases), for easy storage in your cabin.

CLOTHING TO BRING:

- Lightweight, comfortable sportswear
- Swimsuits
- Light sweater or jacket for evenings
- Walking shoes for time ashore
- Sunglasses and hat

Dress code: Always casual and informal

ESSENTIALS:

- Sunscreen (reef-safe recommended)
- Sunglasses
- Hat
- Walking shoes

PACKING CHECKLIST: Use this QR code to grab a free Packing Guide. It's a simple checklist that makes sure you bring everything you need for your adventure. No more forgotten essentials!

Electronic Devices

Personal Electronics are welcome:

- ✓ Cameras, phones, satellite phones, computers, tablets, and e-readers
- ✓ Drones are permitted in Raja Ampat for recreational use, subject to Indonesian regulations (max 150 m altitude, daylight only, at least 15 km from airports, and respect for local customary “sasi” zones).



The following devices are prohibited:

Prohibited Equipment	Notes
 Underwater Scooters	Prohibited.
 Electric Surfboards	Includes e-foils, jetboards, powered surfboards, and similar devices.



CHECK WITH AIRLINE: Some airlines have restrictions on lithium batteries in checked bags. Check your airline's rules before packing.

Required Dive Equipment

All divers are required to have the following equipment. You may either bring your own or rent on board.

- Mask
- Fins
- Snorkel
- Buoyancy Compensator (BCD)
- Regulator with an Alternate Air source and a visible pressure gauge
- Dive Computer
- Tank (*provided*)
- Weights (*provided*)
- Weight belt (*provided*)
- Surface Marker Buoy (SMB) with reel
- 3mm wetsuit and hood

Personal Dive Equipment

Mark each piece of your personal gear with waterproof paint or tape. Many pieces of diving equipment look similar, so make sure yours is clearly labeled.

Guests should also consider additional personal safety equipment such as:

- Dive Alert
- Nautilus Rescue Radio
- Whistle
- Mirror

WHY SMB & REEL ARE REQUIRED:

If you surface away from the dive tender, your surface marker helps the staff to track your location for pickup. You are encouraged to practice deploying yours before the trip or on the initial check-out dive.

Airline Travel & Checked Bags:

WHAT TO CARRY ON THE PLANE: Pack these in your carry-on bag (NOT checked luggage):

- Passport and travel documents
- Dive certification card
- Medical form

- Money and credit cards
- Prescription medications
- One change of clothes (including swimsuit)
- Basic toiletries

Why? If your checked bag is delayed, having essentials in your carry-on means you can still dive on Day 1. Once the yacht leaves port, it cannot receive deliveries until it returns.

CHECK YOUR AIRLINE'S RULES: Different airlines have different limits for:

- Number of bags
- Weight limits
- Size restrictions
- Extra fees

BUSY SEASON RESTRICTIONS:

- Some airlines reduce luggage allowance during high season (December - April).
- You might only get one checked bag instead of two.

DIVE GEAR FEES:

- Many airlines charge extra fees for dive equipment.
- Check if your airline offers a "sports equipment" allowance.

Communication with Home – Staying In Touch

Before departure:	Share your itinerary with family
Emergency contact:	+1-706-664-0111 available 24/7
In port:	Most cell phones will work if they have international roaming or data.
At sea:	Cellular signal is occasional, depending on the yacht's location and your service provider.
	The yacht has a satellite phone for emergencies. Email service (when available) is text-only.
Return day:	Most cell phones will work if they have international roaming or data.

Tip: Send a “heading out for the trip” message before departure so family knows you may be offline by choice.

Green the Fleet Tips

Contribute to the Green the Fleet sustainability initiatives. Here are a few reminders to keep in mind as you get ready for your adventure:

- Avoid traveling with single-use plastics.
- Remove packaging from any new purchases before traveling.
- Travel with a refillable water bottle for hydration.
- Use rechargeable batteries whenever possible. Plan to bring home used batteries so they can be properly disposed of.
- Use an environmentally friendly or ocean-safe sunscreen.
- Be environmentally conscious in everything you do.

3. GETTING THERE

Arrival Airports:

- Kalimantan Airport / Berau Airport (BEJ), Berau, East Kalimantan, Indonesia
 - Approximately 2 hours by car from Tanjung Batu, where you will board the yacht.
- Berau is a small city. Most hotels are close to the airport, with the 2-hour transfer to Tanjung Batu provided on charter start day.

Recommended Arrival Times:

AGGRESSOR RECOMMENDS: Arrive one day early

- Flights can be delayed
- Luggage can be lost
- Customs can take longer than expected
- Better to arrive relaxed than stressed
- Reaching Berau typically requires multiple connecting flights
- Plan for the 2-hour car transfer from Berau to Tanjung Batu on charter day

If you arrive on charter start day:

- Arrive at BEJ before 9 am
- Pickup from Berau hotels and airport: 10 am
- Boarding at Tanjung Batu: by 12 noon
- Yacht departs Tanjung Batu at 1:30 pm
- Approximately 6 hours of cruising to reach the Derawan Islands

Transfer Options:

As the destinations are away from typical tourist infrastructure, formal docking facilities and marinas are not available in the area. To ensure a seamless arrival experience, we provide complimentary transfers to the yacht directly from a local hotel or the airport

- Airport and hotel transfers from Berau to Tanjung Batu are complimentary on charter start and end days.
- Guests staying overnight at a Berau hotel will be picked up at 10 am and transferred by car to Tanjung Batu (~2 hours).
- Guests arriving on charter start day will be met at Berau Airport (BEJ) and transferred directly to Tanjung Batu.
- After all guests are on board, the yacht departs Tanjung Batu at 1:30 pm.
- The cruise to the Derawan Islands takes approximately 6 hours.

Port and Dockage Details

As we explore some of the region's most remote and unspoiled destinations, formal marinas and docking facilities are not available. The yacht will be moored or anchored offshore, and our diving tenders will be on hand to transfer you comfortably to and from the vessel.

Pickup from Berau: 10 am (charter start day)

Check-In: 12 noon at Tanjung Batu

Yacht Departs: 1:30 pm

Check-Out: 8 am on the last day



All guests must be on board by the boarding window close. The yacht will depart Tanjung Batu at 1:30 pm and cannot return for late arrivals.

4. ON BOARD LIFE

Accommodations & Services

All rooms are air-conditioned and equipped with:

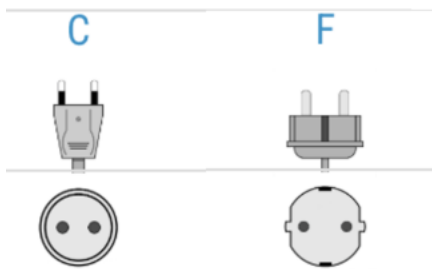
- Private toilet, shower, and sink
- Hair dryer
- Bathrobe
- Towels changed as needed - hang to dry and reuse to support Green Fleet
- Linens (changed mid-week)

STATEROOM SIZE:

- Rooms are compact (approximately 80 square feet / 7.5 square meters) but comfortable. The Raja Ampat Aggressor has 8 staterooms accommodating 16 guests.
- Master Stateroom: queen bed OR queen bed + twin bunk; Deluxe Staterooms: L-shaped twin beds
- All cabins have private en-suite bathroom, individual climate control, TV with media player, and hair dryer
- Main deck cabins (#1, #2) have portholes; others have picture windows
- The rooms are designed for divers who spend most of their time on deck or underwater
- Guests store soft luggage under their beds
- There is limited storage – so travel light

Electricity

- The yacht uses 220V outlets, plug types C and F (European-style two-pin) in common areas
- The yacht uses 110V outlets, multi-use plug in the cabins
- Most phone chargers and laptop adapters work with 110V or 220V — check yours to be sure.
- The camera and strobe charging station provides 110V outlets for photo and video equipment.

Meals

The culinary team prepares a variety of Indonesian feasts and local cuisine alongside international dishes.

- Breakfast: Cooked-to-order hot entrees, fresh fruit, cereals, and juices
- Lunch: Buffet-style with homemade soups, breads, salads, and sandwiches
- Dinner: Elegant plated service featuring seafood, beef, or chicken, paired with fresh vegetables and homemade desserts
- Snacks: Served mid-morning and mid-afternoon

Dietary Medical Restrictions:

If you have special medical dietary restrictions, please note them in your GIS reservation and discuss them with the yacht chef upon boarding so they can properly prepare to meet your needs.

The destination's remote location means limited access to specialty items. For strict dietary needs:

- Bring critical items with you (gluten-free pasta, specific protein powders, etc.)
- Discuss options with chef on Day 1
- Be flexible - ingredients may not match exactly what you eat at home.

Beverages

Complimentary beverages include:

- Fruit juices
- Soft drinks
- Iced water and iced tea
- Coffee
- Limited selection of local beer and wine

For other alcohol and spirits, you are encouraged to bring your special brand from your home country. Due to the high duty charged on liquor in Indonesia, this is the best option. Due to local regulations, the bar will be closed while the yacht is in port.



Drinking and diving do not mix. Once you consume alcohol, you become a sunbather until the next day.

Communications / Internet



There is an onboard satellite communications device for emergencies. The yacht is in cellular range occasionally, where cellular-based WiFi Internet (3G and above) connectivity (email) becomes available. This will depend on your service provider and the yacht's location. If you need to contact the outside world, please ask the staff in what areas a signal might be available. All communication services the destination provides are charged based on data usage (airtime). Email service (if available) is restricted to text-only messages.

Ships Boutique

- There is a small on board boutique offering assorted t-shirts and other items.
- Your bill for on board services and boutique items will be settled on the last day of diving.
- After returning home, if you still want boutique items, please visit the Aggressor online boutique at www.aggressor.com.

Fees & Taxes (Pay on Board)

Each guest will pay a port fee at the end of the charter. These fees support local port services, environmental permits, and government assessments.

The yacht accepts cash (Indonesian Rupiah, Euro, or US Dollars) or Visa/MasterCard. Credit cards incur a 2.5% surcharge. USD bills must be brand new, unfolded, unmarked, crisp \$100 banknotes dated after 2006 — otherwise a 5% fee applies.

If you already hold a valid Raja Ampat Marine Park Entry Permit (the “MPA tag,” valid 12 months from purchase), you must inform the reservations office at least 10 days before your trip and bring the permit on board. If the office is not notified within this time, the standard port fee will be charged on board. Bring some Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) — overweight baggage charges at the airport must be paid in local currency.

Fees are paid onboard at the end of your trip during checkout. Travelers' checks and personal checks cannot be accepted.

Smoking / Vaping Policy

- **Smoking and vaping are strictly prohibited anywhere inside the yacht or on the dive deck.**
- Smoking and vaping are only permitted on the bow of the yacht.
- Please respect non-smoking guests.

Entertainment

There are a variety of nightly entertainment options:

- Diving videos
- Movies
- Games
- Marine life identification and destination presentations

The yacht offers a collection of movies and TV shows that can be watched in the salon or in your room. If you have a favorite movie, digital slide show, or video to share, bring it along!

A small library of marine life identification books is also available for reference.

Special Occasions

If you will be celebrating a special occasion such as a birthday, anniversary, honeymoon, wedding, or your 100th dive, please notify the staff so they can help celebrate your occasion.

Kindly inform the reservation office before traveling so they can notify the staff in advance.

Gratuities

- Staff gratuities are not included in the charter.
- Gratuities are voluntary and should be based on the quality of service provided by the staff.
- When settling your bill, the Captain will have an envelope for gratuities that will be divided equally among the staff.
- Payment can be made by cash (Indonesian Rupiah, Euro, or US Dollars), Visa, or MasterCard. Sorry, no personal checks or traveler's checks.

Health & Medications

The Raja Ampat Aggressor has a first aid kit on board, including oxygen and an AED.

Motion Sickness: You might want to bring motion sickness medication if you think you'll need it. There are several over-the-counter brands for motion sickness medication. You can also consult your doctor about prescription options, such as the transdermal patch or Scopace tablets.

Currents and winds may cause moderate movement of the yacht at times.

Medication Storage:

Aggressor yachts and their staff cannot accept any medication brought on board for safekeeping, including those that require refrigeration. Guests needing temperature-sensitive medication should travel with a cooling case or small cooler with several blue ice packets. The staff will gladly store and recharge the blue ice but cannot accept responsibility for the proper care or storage of medication. This should be kept in your room.

5. DIVING INFORMATION

Diving Operations

All diving on Aggressor Liveboard yachts is recreational and non-decompression. Aggressor Liveboards do not support technical diving, rebreathers, or diving with double tanks.

In the Derawan Islands, all dives are conducted from two dive tenders. The yacht anchors or moors near dive sites, and tenders ferry small groups to and from each site. A staff member will accompany each tender group and be in the water to offer assistance and ensure the group stays together. All dives begin with a comprehensive briefing from the staff.

You and your buddy control your dive plan while following the briefing and your certification agency's limits. Guests are not required to follow the staff in the water. If a buddy team needs to surface early, the entire group is not required to abort the dive — the buddy team should follow the briefing and signal the tender driver that everything is OK once on the surface.



All dives must remain within recreational limits. No decompression diving is permitted.

Typical Schedule

- Up to 4 dives per day (including night dives)
- No decompression dives (recreational limits only)
- Night dives available on several evenings

Dive Supervision

- Diving is not just an activity; it's a passion for exploring the underwater world. That's why the dive program is built around empowering you and your buddy to take control of your diving experience.
- While in the water, you and your buddy are in charge.
- Every dive starts with a thorough briefing from the dive staff, covering site conditions, points of interest, and safety procedures.
- As certified divers, you and your buddy are responsible for planning and carrying out your dives while respecting your experience limits and those set by the briefing and your certification agency.
- Divers are not directly supervised - each buddy team manages their own dive.
- If you surface early, only your buddy team surfaces – other divers may continue their dive per the plan and briefing.

Equipment Storage:

- Each guest will be assigned a designated seat on the dive deck and a personal locker or cubby to store items.
- There are also rails and hangers for your wetsuits.
- Freshwater showers are located on the back deck for post-dive comfort.
- Warm towels are provided after each dive.

Tanks & Fills & Nitrox

- Standard tanks: 80 cu ft aluminum tanks with DIN/yoke adaptable valves.
- Fills: Air included.
- Nitrox: A 32% blend is available for divers who are Nitrox certified for an additional fee. Please see www.aggressor.com for pricing.
- Large-capacity tanks (100 cu ft) are available by request for guests who want extra capacity.

If any of your dive equipment fails while on board, the staff will lend you equipment free of charge.



Wetsuit Rentals:

You are strongly encouraged to bring your own wetsuit to ensure optimal comfort and thermal protection during your dives. Since wetsuit fit is highly individual and vital for both comfort and warmth, bringing your personal wetsuit will provide the best diving experience. Surface Marker Buoys (SMBs) and reels are also not available for rent on board, so you must bring your own. Other rental equipment is readily available.

Itinerary Details:

The Derawan Islands itinerary departs and returns to Tanjung Batu, exploring an archipelago of 31 islands off the eastern coast of Borneo in the Celebes Sea. Located on the western edge of the Coral Triangle, the Derawan archipelago is exceptionally biodiverse — home to 872 species of reef fish, 507 species of coral, and protected wildlife including five giant clam species, two sea turtle species, and the land-based coconut crab. After boarding at Tanjung Batu, the yacht cruises approximately 6 hours to reach the diving grounds.

All diving is from two dive tenders, with a mix of drift dives, wall dives, caves, and macro sites.

Highlights include:

- Sangalaki: Year-round population of green turtles and feeding manta rays. The island has a turtle nursery run by the local government, and whale sharks are frequently seen offshore.
- Maratua Atoll: Signature dives at "The Channel" and "Big Fish Country" with tornadoes of barracuda, grey reef sharks, thresher sharks, schooling eagle rays, and turtles. Maratua has at least 13 known caves with hundreds more unexplored.
- Kakaban Island: Famous for its non-stinging Jellyfish Lake — a unique snorkeling experience — plus thrilling cave dives and walls.
- Talisayan: Whale shark encounters at the bagans (traditional fishing platforms) where whale sharks feed on sardines released by fishermen.
- Pulau Panjang & Pulau Derawan: A macro photographer's paradise with satomi pygmy seahorses, sea dragons, ghost pipefish, frogfish, blue-ring octopus, harlequin shrimp, and tiger shrimp.

7-night trip: 19–22 dives, including night dives.

Average dive estimates depend on weather conditions and crossings.

Diving Conditions

- Water temperature: 82–86°F (28–30°C)
- Air temperature: 78–88°F (26–31°C)
- Wetsuit: 3mm wetsuit and hood recommended
- Visibility: Generally good, often 60–100+ feet (18–30+ meters); can vary at channel sites and macro/jetty sites
- Currents: Maratua's channel sites can have strong currents. Drift diving is common, and a reef hook is recommended for some channel dives.

- Operating season: September to May (the Raja Ampat Aggressor does not operate Derawan itineraries June through August)

Seasonal Breakdown:

- **Peak Season (October–April):** Water 82–84°F (28–29°C); air 78–86°F (26–30°C). Calmer seas, best visibility (often 80–100+ feet / 25–30+ meters). 3mm wetsuit and hood recommended.
- **Shoulder (May / September):** Water 83–85°F (28–29°C); air 79–87°F (26–31°C). Variable conditions, occasional plankton blooms (good for mantas). 3mm wetsuit recommended.
- **Off-Season (June–August):** Water 84–86°F (29–30°C); air 80–88°F (27–31°C). The Raja Ampat Aggressor typically does not operate during these months due to seasonal winds. The yacht repositions to other regions.

Scuba Training:

Enhance your education while on board an Aggressor yacht!

The courses available include:

- Advanced Open Water Diver (SSI or PADI)
- Enriched Air / Nitrox Courses (SSI or PADI)

Course fees are due once on board and after the instructor confirms your course. The training agency providing your course will depend on your instructor's affiliations.

A diver participating in scuba training will need to complete a medical history form. Please be sure to review the form prior to traveling and ensure you do not need a physician's signature.



Photo & Video

Photography: The Raja Ampat Aggressor offers free photography coaching. The yacht has a 110V strobe charging station and a large camera table for camera and video equipment. Guests should bring their own battery chargers.

As a safety precaution, all lithium-ion batteries must be charged outside at the camera station and cannot be charged inside the yacht.

Video Service: The Video Professional can capture your diving adventure on board the Raja Ampat Aggressor to share with family and friends.

Nearest Chamber

The nearest hyperbaric chamber is in Balikpapan, East Kalimantan. You are encouraged to have a full physical exam before your adventure if you have any concerns, and always dive conservatively.

Prohibited Diving Activities:

The following diving activities are not supported and are prohibited on Aggressor Liveboards:

- Use of spear guns, Hawaiian slings, or collecting of any kind
- Solo diving
- Use of double tanks
- Use of underwater scooters
- Decompression or technical diving
- Touching, chasing, or disturbing marine life of any kind

6. AFTER YOUR ADVENTURE

Check-Out Time:

Check-out time is 8 am on the last day of the charter for all guests. At this time, all guests and their luggage must be off the yacht so staff have adequate time to prepare for new guests arriving in just a few hours.

Departure Schedule:

Complimentary transfers are provided on the charter end day to:

- Berau Airport (BEJ) for guests with departing flights (~2-hour car transfer)
- A local Berau hotel for guests extending their stay

Plan departure flights from BEJ accordingly — allow extra time for the 2-hour transfer from Tanjung Batu to Berau.

For any guest choosing to extend their stay, the staff will be happy to organize tours, so you have time to off-gas and enjoy the land sights. All tours are at an additional charge and are highly recommended.
